

There are two types of Caesar Ciphers that are easy to replicate for students. The first is a basic alphabet strip like we saw above. You shift the alphabet over and then use the bottom row's letters to write your code. (Again, if you start at A/A **one** shift would be A/B.)

A	B	C	D	E	F	G	H	I	J	K	L	M	N	O	P	Q	R	S	T	U	V	W	X	Y	Z

The second kind of Caesar Cipher is the Caesar Cipher wheel. The outer ring of the wheel represents the letters that make up your ACTUAL message. **In our example, there is an arrow above the inner wheel's A to help align the shift.**
